## MARINE NOTES

The body of a man, who is supposed to have been Capt. H P Larsen, of the steam barge Africa, which was wrecked on Loyal Island during a storm on the night of October 7th last, was found on the lake shore, about seven miles from Stokes' Bay, Tuesday. The body is in a badly decomposed condition, but the clothing is well preserved and it may lead to positive identification.

The steam barge Samoa, owned by Brown & Co., Buffalo, struck a rock in Waterous Bay and sank within a few minutes after the accident on Tuesday. The barge Celtic, owned by G K Jackson, of Bay City, Mich., is on the shoal. Both barges had grain cargoes consigned to the Prescott elevator. The Samon carried 74,000 bushels of oats and the Celtic 47,882 bushels of corn. The Celtic was in tow of the Samon at the time of the accident.
