MARINE.

The schooner Emily B. Maxwell left port on Sunday afternoon after spending eight or nine days in port.

The Owen Sound Sun says that it is probable that the steel steamer Seguin will be lengthened forty feet this winter.

Owing to the gale on Tuesday the dredge was obliged to stop working as it was impossible to take the scows outside to be dumped.

The schooner M. L. Breck came in port on Tuesday afternoon during the gale. Her cargo consisted of 700 barrels of salt for Messrs. T. Long & Bro.

The steamer Telegram left here Saturday morning, but was compelled to run into Meaford owing to the gale. The steamer got away Sunday afternoon.

The American canal at Sault Ste. Marie will be closed on Nov. 15th, consequently the larger boats will be compelled to use the Canadian canal during the remainder of the season.

The steamer Legonda entered Owen Sound on Thursday with a cargo of 220,000 bushels, viz., 150,000 bushels of oats and 70,000 bushels of corn, weighing 4,500 tons. The vessel is 400 feet long and 45 feet beam.

The steambarge City of Berlin ran aground on the shoal near Ginn Rock Light house Tuesday at noon, during a snow storm. Her cargo of corn is for

Midland. She lies in an exposed position, and may be damaged a good deal.

The tugs Bob Foote and D'Alton McCarthy returned from the fishing grounds this week. The former had four skiffs in tow. During the storm on the night of Tuesday, 3rd inst. they broke away and were with great difficulty picked up. All arrived safe on Wednesday.

The sunken steamer Idaho is lying in Long Point Bay, about twelve miles off Port Dover and six miles north of Long Point Light. One pole mast is out of water, showing the top peak halliard above the water. The steamer is headed about southwest. A portion of the wreckage was picked up by the fishing tug German, from Port Dover.

The steamer Idaho, of the Western Transit Line, foundered off Long Point on Lake Erie on Saturday morning at four o'clock. But two of the crew of twenty one remain to tell the tale. The steamer left Buffalo Friday afternoon in the face of a big gale, bound for Chicago, loaded with packet freight. Capt. Alex. Gillies went down with the vessel. The two survivors, Louis Laforce, jr., second mate, and W. Gill, a deck hand, were picked up from a spar by the steel steamer Mariposa on Saturday afternoon.

The G. T. R. elevator at Goderich was destroyed by fire on Friday night. The fire spread along the water front and consumed 3,500,000 feet of lumber owned by N. Dymont, of Barrie, and 1,500,000 feet owned by W. Rutson, of Goderich. The elevator contained 40,000 bushels of wheat, a portion of which had been unloaded from the steamer St Andrew that day. The grain was totally destroyed. The schooner

Todmen, Capt. Lawson, was damaged to the extent of \$300, and a number of tugs owned by the Buffalo Fish Co., were more or less damaged.
