

Another Steamer to be Built Here

At the annual meeting of the Farrar Transportation Co., held in the company's head office here on Tuesday afternoon, it was decided to build a 9,000-ton steamer, to be ready to go into commission in the spring of 1907. The contract will be given to the Collingwood Shipbuilding Company.
