

Refuses to Sell Share in Steamer

One of the conditions of the settlement of the recent suit of the Northern Navigation Co. against the estate of the late J. J. Long in which the plaintiff secured judgment for \$34,500, was that the steamer *Cly of Windsor* would be transferred to the company.

The executors of the Long estate and the other owners, with the exception of Capt. P. M. Campbell, who holds a one-ninth interest in the steamer, are agreeable to the fulfillment of the steamer. Capt. Campbell, however, objects, on the grounds that he must be paid arrearages of salary and that other claims of his must first be settled.

A writ has, therefore, been applied for by the other owners, Long's executors* of four-ninths, Sandford H. Lindsay, executor of the Charles Cameron estate of three-ninths, and J. K. McLaughlin of one-ninth, for an order compelling Capt. Campbell to carry out an agreement in writing signed by himself to transfer the ship to the Northern Navigation Co.
