

MARINERS ARE ENGAGING

Capt. A. McKenzie has been appointed captain of the steamer Telegram, now of the Dominion Transportation Co.'s line. The steamer will in all probability make semi-weekly trips from Owen Sound to points on the Bruce peninsula and south shore of the Manitoulin. Capt. McKenzie has had charge of the tug Harrison for the past two years.
