The steamer Gordon Campbell, a stranger in this port, came in on Tuesday morning with a cargo of 40,000 bushels of wheat from Fort Willam. The grain belonged to Rianardson & Co. of Kingston. Wale oming down Lake Superior the shaft of the steamer broke an assistance had to be secured. Upon reaching the Soo the steame was taken in tow by the tug Roch and brought here. Her cargo was discharged at the G.T.R. elevator and the steamer is now awailing her turn to go on the dry dock, which will not yet come for fire or six days, the steamer Iroquels being yet under repair. The Gordon Campbell formerly belonged to the Anchor Line and in her earlier days was one of the first-class steamers on the upper takes.

On Modday the Northern Navigation Co. received word that their fine steamer Huronic and grounded in the Soo River and was seriously damaged. It has since been learned that the steamer struck bottom in the mouth of the upper channel of the entance to the Canadian canal and that her bottom was so damaged as to cause three compartments to be filled with water. The cause assigned for the accident is that the range lights were out.
