BUY STEAMER CUBA.

On Tuesday The Star said: Northern Navigation stock sold at 99 this morning. It is announced that owing to the unusual amount of freight being handled by the company this year, it has been necessary to provide extra tonnage to carry it. A large American package freight steamer has been purchased, and will be added to their Lake Superior fleet, which will make four vessels, running out of Sarnia to Port Arthur and Fort William. It is expected the vessel will be available for the route by Sept. 1st, and will be immediately placed in commission. Upon being spoken to by The Bulletin, Mr. A. Macdonald, auditor of freight and passenger accounts, confirmed the above report, stating that the company had purchased the freighter Cuba. This, he added, was made necessary by the large increase in the company's business on the Lake Superior Division. He expected the company would receive the steamer on the 15th inst.
