

NAVIGATION NOTES. PI

Capt. Farrow of Windsor was in charge of the steamer Manitoba on the last trip. He took the place of Capt. McIntyre, who was off duty owing to the death of his only son, on Wednesday.

The steamer Phoenix of the Hall Co., Ogdensburg, carried away the gates at lock No. 18 on the Cornwall Canal on Friday and tied up traffic. The steamer which was light knocked out all the gates and permitted the waters to flood the lower streets of the town.

New municipal freight sheds have been opened at Goderich and steamers of the Inland Line are making regular calls at that port.

Capt. James Reid, the well-known wrecker, of Sarnia, is reported dying.

The tug Monk struck a rock near Amherstburg and was only saved from sinking by being beached.

The steamer Leuty which is frequently in Collingwood harbor, unshipped her rudder while in Lake Michigan and had to run into Alpena for repairs.

The steamer D. A. Gordon, down-bound with a cargo of flour, went ashore on the southern end of Shoul Rocks, between Parisian and Sandy Islands, Saturday night in a thunder-storm. She went out four feet with forepeak and number one tank full of water. The tugs which tried to release her have returned to Sault Ste. Marie for a lighter.
