

TWO STEAMERS TO BE LAUNCHED

Mr. F. S. Seixas, manager of the Niagara, St. Catharines and Toronto Navigation Co., was in town on Tuesday and spent some time in the shipyards making an inspection of the new steamer Dalhousie now on the stocks for his company. The steamer is expected to go into commission on July 1st between Toronto and Port Dalhousie. It is well advanced and may be launched about June 15th. When on her route across Lake Ontario the steamer will be associated with the steamers Lakeside and Garden City.

The date for the launch of the Hepburn steamer, Geronia, has not yet been definitely determined, but it is expected that it will be next week.

The steamer E. M. Peck arrived from Chicago on Monday morning with a cargo of 86,500 bushels of corn. After discharging the cargo the steamer cleared for Buffalo to load coal.

The body of Frank Lowe, fireman of the tug General, sunk in collision with the Canadian Pacific liner Athabasca last November, was recovered on the 24th near Lime Island by the United States revenue-cutter Marigold.
